

**Crab Apple (Malus sylvestris var)** 

On Fishpool Brook side, by telegraph pole, Millennium Park

For its wonderfully abundant crop of rosy apples that bow branches and its value to wildlife.





This multi-stemmed tree with its spreading branches creates a safe habitat for a range of wildlife and is an early food source for bees and other insects searching for pollen and nectar. In autumn blackbirds, thrushes and crows eat the apples as do a range of mammals including mice, voles, foxes and badgers. Because the fruit is lightweight, it stays on the tree longer and so sustains wildlife for longer than other trees.
