6 The next 12 months:

The events we plan and present to members and volunteers are always with the funding consideration as a primary consideration. The current pattern of two members afternoon teas and a summer and winter volunteer event is working well so this will be our aim with final decisions taken nearer the time.

The current idea for the members afternoon tea is a St George's Day celebration in April 2025.

The volunteer walks will continue during the lighter months for those who wish to attend. For those that do not want to walk there is always a chance to join the group for a pint afterwards.

The current balance of members to volunteers is working well. We are currently able to support requests for befriending and transport so we are doing well, with approximately 100 tasks each month which has been consistent for a few years.

7 Volunteer Feedback:

No feedback was received before the meeting. Angie wanted to report that she gets very positive feedback from the members and families she supports with both home visits and car trips out to local shops and garden centres, with charity shops being very popular.

A discussion was then held about how to promote the scheme to attract both new members and volunteers. It was suggested that posters are placed in the doctors waiting room, the Pharmacy, Parish

Council window, the pet shop, the Cons Club, and on various notice boards within the village. Sharon stated she needed more leaflets to give out, and it was suggested we check the other outlets such as the library and Pharmacy to see if they need more. Note: this action can be progressed at the next Promotions Meeting on 6th August

8 Questions & Answers:

Karen asked whether anyone at the meeting would be interested in having some training for the Telco Role, and reiterated that it is a very rewarding role as you get to talk to lots of the members who are so grateful for the support that have been provided. Rose and Sharon both said they were interested and will join Joyce who has covered the role in previous years - thank you all.

Alan asked if we record how members and volunteers have heard about us. The most popular is via Social Prescribing at the doctors, or directly from the doctor or Pharmacy, although there has been a few via existing members. We do not record where volunteers have heard about us.

9 Closing Statement:


